And what a start to the two days it was, with the contest bursting to life in the second half with a glut of scores at both ends before a mightily relieved Carron/New Quay/Fanore side emerged victorious with two points to spare over a very brave Toonagh outfit.

The Carron/New Quay/Fanore side were dominant in the first half with Costello (3) and Emily Howard (2) firing over points as they poured for-ward, but a breakaway goal by Barry Whelan after eight minutes ensured that the Mid-Clare side were still in the contest at the break as matters rested at 0-5 to 1-0.

Then came lift-off in the second half as the game turned into a thrilling spectacle, with Toonagh sub Daniel McInerney hitting 1-1 inside five minutes, while Costello responded with a goal from a free-kick for Carron/New Quay/Fanore as they edged ahead by 1-5 to 2-1.
